SERMON SUMMARY

The world says the source of our joy is found in friends, family, money, work, vacations, health, status, etc., but they all let us down. All the sources of joy the world talks about boil down to other people meeting our needs and good circumstances. Both of which are a flimsy foundation for joy. What is the true source of our joy? Biblical joy is confidence, given by the Holy Spirit, enabled by the Gospel, that gives us protection, perspective, and passion.

Joy gives us protection. How can joy protect us? It keeps us from despair and from stress that can overtake us.

Joy gives us perspective. Joy must carry a prophetic understanding. Eschatology produces joy. Are things going to get worse in an eschatological sense? Yes. But will they also get much better? Yes! Joy is putting pain in its proper perspective. Pain is an awareness of the brokenness of the world around us and our weakness in the face of it. We can medicate our pain or use it as a reminder. Pain, through the context of the Gospel, is a means of rejoicing! Pain does not negate joy; it sits right next to it and reminds us of our joy.

Joy gives us passion. We find our purpose in finding the joy of the Lord. We walk in a new passion when we find the purpose of God. How do we receive this kind of joy? Drawing close to the true source of our joy, Jesus Christ. We cannot draw near to God without the Gospel of Jesus.

In Hebrews 12:2, what was the joy set before Jesus? The establishment of the new covenant (God with us), the satisfaction of justice, and the extension of grace. But why? Who was God getting at? Us! You and I were the joy set before Him, and through His sacrifice, Jesus made joy available to all people.
